Program Features

Curriculum Delivery

- Courses follow a traditional semester format – 16 weeks in fall/spring, 12 weeks in summer
- Courses are primarily taught online, but may include some synchronous class sessions held in real time with the option to attend from a distance via videoconferencing technology
- Optional on-campus opportunities to gain hands-on experience running simulations
- Practicum sites and supervisors are arranged by students and can be completed in your home community, allowing students to find an opportunity that best aligns with their teaching interests and develop relationships that may lead to future employment opportunities

On-Campus Attendance Requirements

- MSN Orientation Day (held the week before classes begin)
- Approximately five on-site lab days in the Advanced Physical Assessment course
- MSN Professional Practice Day (held the final spring semester)

*Tuition and Fees (2019-2020)**

- In-state: \$578 per credit hour / approximately \$24,276 for 42 credit hour program
- Out-of-state: \$1,553 per credit hour / approximately \$65,226 for 42 credit hour program
- Residents of Midwest Exchange Program states (IL, KS, MI, MN, MO, NE, ND, OH, WI): \$867 per credit hour/ approximately \$36,414 for 42 credit hour program
- General University fees and course fees: Approximately \$3,000 total for 42 credit hour program

Scholarships and Financial Aid

- IUSON participates in the federal **Nurse Faculty Loan Program**, which provides up to \$35,500 in funding per academic year, and up to 85% loan forgiveness after four years of full-time employment as nursing faculty at an accredited school of nursing
- Over \$700,000 in scholarships are awarded annually to undergraduate and graduate students. Students are considered for all scholarships for which they are eligible via a single application
- Research and teaching assistantships are offered each semester that allow students to gain valuable experience and earn a tuition waiver for one course
- Students are eligible for federal direct student loans (up to \$20,500 annually)

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Admissions

Admission Criteria

- A BSN degree from a CNEA, CCNE, or ACEN accredited program
- A cumulative undergraduate GPA of 3.0 or higher on a 4.0 scale
- A current, unencumbered RN license issued by any of the 50 U.S. states
- Knowledge, skills, and abilities to use a computer and other technologies to communicate
- GRE is not required

Prerequisite

- Completion of an undergraduate statistics course of any level from a four-year university with a grade of B- (80%) or better. (Applicants may be admitted without having met this prerequisite, but it must be met before enrolling in the MSN program.)

Application Materials

- Electronic IUPUI graduate application
- Contact information for three professional references
- Responses to five short essay questions
- A detailed resume
- Proof of your RN license
- Official transcripts from all postsecondary institutions attended outside of the IU System

Admission Timeline

- Applications to the MSN program are accepted year-round
- Admission to the Nursing Education track is offered every fall, spring, and summer semester
- Completed applications (including all supplemental materials) must be received by the following deadlines:
 - Spring — December 1
 - Summer— April 1
 - Fall—July 15
- Admissions decisions are sent out 2-3 weeks after receiving your completed application
